WHEREAS, the Village intends to install electric vehicle charging stations at three proposed locations in the Village on West Main Street, Agawam Park and Railroad Plaza; and

WHEREAS, the ZEV program requires separate applications to be submitted for each proposed ZEV infrastructure location; and

WHEREAS, the ZEV program provides funding to furnish and install eligible infrastructure and may support certain operating costs for a period of two years; and

WHEREAS, the ZEV program requires applicants to provide matching funds in the amount of 20% of the requested grant funds; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, the Village Board of the Village of Southampton hereby support submission of three grant applications to the ZEV program for the following estimated amounts:

West Main: Grant request \$7,695, match \$1,539
Agawam: Grant request \$7,496, match \$1,249
Railroad Plaza: Grant request \$8,899, match \$1,483, and
