TAKING SAFETY TO THE STREET

Special Salute and thank you to Southampton's Finest: our Police, Fire, Ambulance, Dispatch, and Life Guards. My goal this year is "Taking Safety to the Street?"

Be it with our soon-to-come Coffee with a Cop event, Fire Safety Tips, and CPR/First Aid training program. With the hope, "A better-informed community is a safer community?"

Here are just a few highlights of the services they provide:

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Southampton Village Police have implemented several new safety measures throughout the past year. One is the creation of our Commercial Vehicle Traffic Enforcement Team. This team has conducted several DOT Safety Inspections on Commercial Vehicles utilizing our Village roadways. They have taken several unsafe trucks out of service due to the hazardous condition of the vehicles.

This team also supplements our Community Response Unit, along with our dedicated Motorcycle Patrol, which handles traffic concerns that impact our Village and our residents' quality of life.

DRONE PATROL

Almost a year before Governor Hochul's distribution of Drones to the state, I'm proud to announce that Southampton Village's Drone Patrol was already in place. Several of our Officers have become FAA Certified in Drone Operations. Coopers Beach in Southampton Village ranked #3 on the list of the nation's best beaches for 2023, attracting many beachgoers worldwide. Shark sightings have increased throughout recent years in the Northeast. As Safety Liaison along with the Southampton Village Police Department we deployed our Drones to monitor the waters over our 7 miles of oceanfront beaches, keeping our swimmers safe and the lifeguards aware of shark sightings.

BUSINESS DISTRICT SAFETY

Chief Hurteau has dedicated two full-time police officers and one seasonal police officer to a steady foot post/bicycle patrol in the Business District during the summer months to enforce

our Village Codes, assist with pedestrian traffic, and keep our businesses safe. It also allows our officers to engage with the public and business owners as they strive to have a great relationship with both entities.

SOUTHAMPTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

In recent weeks, our area has seen flash flooding, with the department answering many alarms for flooded vehicles and houses. The department reminds the public to avoid driving through deep water, as it only takes a few inches to stop a vehicle in its tracks. As the Fall approaches, please ensure you clean your chimneys before use. And replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE

The Ambulance department maintains a complete volunteer membership supplemented by one advanced life support provider 24/7 with an impressive response time of approximately 4 minutes for a medical provider to arrive on the scene from the time of dispatch. The department would also like to urge residents and business owners to make sure their street number is prominently displayed in a clear and easy-to-read manner from the street, preventing any loss of precious time. CPR/First Aid training program, with great success this year, runs monthly CPR and First Aid courses available to the general public.

They will also schedule courses at the request of community members with a cadre of 19 instructors. The importance of early recognition of cardiac arrest, early compressions, and access to AEDs can't be stressed enough. The program dubbed the "Southampton Village Heartsafe Community," hopes to increase access to AEDs in public settings and increase the number of CPR-trained individuals. The program continues year-round, and the agency trains students at Southampton High School, Our Lady of the Hamptons, and the SH Intermediate School.

SAFETY DISPATCH

Southampton Village Public Safety Dispatchers monitor phones and radios for three area fire departments, two local EMS agencies, and the Southampton Village Police. Dispatch staff includes ex-fire chiefs, fire captains, paramedics, national guardsmen and others who volunteer in the community. The room looks like something out of Johnson Space Control, using all the modern tools available. The dispatchers are ready and waiting, able to assist any caller with their emergency, whether it is a cardiac arrest or the delivery of a baby.

SAFE SHORES

The village has increased collaboration amongst Southampton Village Lifeguards, the Southampton Village Police Department, Village EMS, and Southampton Village Ocean Rescue with the sole purpose of enhancing water safety at Coopers Beach and throughout the entire Village of Southampton during the peak summer season. Some efforts have included additional rescue watercraft training and drills, drone surveillance and monitoring, additional medical training such as "Stop the Bleed" for lifeguards and requiring a rescue watercraft ready to launch throughout operational hours. Along with the continued success of our junior lifeguard program, this will allow the Village to enhance, streamline, and strengthen water safety across the entire Village beachfront.

Be part of the movement. One of the most essential skills you can acquire is the ability to respond effectively in emergency situations, especially when it comes to CPR and fire safety. FALL LEAF CLEAN UP

Wednesday, November 1, 2023 thru
Friday, December 29, 2023
As per Village Code,

NO CONTRACTOR OR CONTRACTORS shall place any leaves on the Village right-of-way. Fall leaf pickups shall be for the abutting landowner or employee thereof.

Leaves will be picked up in the following manner:

1. Leaves must be piled in long, neat piles along roadway edge - Not In Roadway!
2. Leaves must be placed in paper Biodegradable bags only (plastic bags are unacceptable).
3. No grass clippings.
4. Biodegradable Bags - Available for purchase at Village Hall & hardware stores.
5. No land clearing or tree and shrub pruning. All mixed piles will be passed by.

The Highway Department does NOT pick up any of the following:

PLASTIC BAGS WILL NO LONGER BE PICKED UP

1. Construction debris
2. Hedge clippings or hedge trimming brush of any kind
3. Grass clippings
4. Potted plants
5. Stumps of any kind
6. Iron fence posts or any type of stakes
7. Rocks or dirt
8. Bricks or blocks
9. No cans, bottles or garbage of any kind
10. No wood or brush of any kind

Disposal of these items is the responsibility of the individual property owner. In the past, many of these items have been mixed in with leaves or brush.

This can cause serious injury to our workers and expensive damage to our machinery.

Gas Powered Leaf Blowers can be used March 15 through May 15th AND October 15 through December 31st no earlier than 8 a.m. or later than 6 p.m. on any weekday and no earlier than 9 a.m. or later than 5 p.m. on Saturday. Gas powered leaf blowers are always prohibited on Sunday and federal and state holidays.

Effective October 1, 2024 the operation of gas powered leaf blowers will be prohibited in the Village of Southampton.

LETTER FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Residents,

It is an honor to serve as your Mayor and to keep you informed on all that is going on in our Village.

The first two months of my administration have been very busy meeting with those in the community as well as with other local officials. I would like to thank the Commission on Veterans Patriotic Events, and all those involved with running a fantastic Fourth of July parade. What a wonderful day to celebrate our independence and our veterans.

We have been able to appoint both a new Chief of Police, Suzanne Hurteau, as well as a new Lieutenant, Ashley Jones and we thank them for their service to the Village in putting others first and keeping us safe. We will be upgrading the radio equipment in the Village dispatch office to ensure 911 and emergency communications for police, fire and ambulance services.

We have adopted our capital budget which outlines capital spending for the Village for the next three years. We will be purchasing a fire rescue truck for the Southampton Village Fire Department, which will be paid for with 40% of the funds coming from the Fire District due to our contract with them. The Department of Public Works will

continue to maintain our Village with a new excavator which will help to clean out our sumps to allow for better drainage from heavy rainfall.

The Village Board approved a contract with Johnson Controls to upgrade the energy efficiency of Village buildings. This will include carbon reducing boiler/furnace replacement; roof replacements and upgrades; A/C improvements; solar renewable energy at 6 locations enhancing net zero goals and the refurbishment of windows at Village Hall and LED street lighting. These changes not only save money but help us become a smart, healthy, and sustainable Village.

We are still working to enhance the quality of the environment in the Village as we are pursuing the wastewater treatment system for the central business district, installing bioswales to help clean stormwater runoff as well as the algae harvester for Lake Agawam, for which we have secured approximately \$10 million in Federal and Town grants.

We have renewed our efforts to seek grant funding to restore our World War I Memorial at Agawam Park and we are excited about the prospect of adding more parkland contiguous to Agawam Park along the western shore of the lake.

We are also excited that SouthamptonFest is back in its 11th year and is on the calendar for the weekend of September 29th. There will be activities for the whole family including the popular chowder contest and we hope that all will participate in this great event right here in our vibrant Village.
